Called to Order: The meeting was called to order at 7:05 pm

Approval of Agenda: It was moved, seconded and carried to adopt the agenda as prepared.

#### Approval of Minutes of Previous Meeting:

It was moved, seconded and carried to adopt the minutes of the April 10 meeting as prepared.

#### Agenda Items:

President's Report

1. Jeff commented that from observations and informal surveys that in general the club membership are happy, that there are new randonneurs entering the club and everything is going well.

### Treasurer's Report

- 1. Cash flow is fine. Expenses are beginning to come in from the Rocky. At this point, mostly for the controls.
- 2. Revenues and expenses for the Fleche are not available yet.
- 3. A rate of \$0.30 per kilometer will be paid to volunteers. This rate will be adjusted for next year.

#### Membership

- 1. All cards have been mailed out to this year's members.
- 2. Gary will ask Cheryl to send a membership list to all members. Contact information will be shown for all members except those who asked for this information to be withheld.

#### Database and Web

Canadian Randonneurs

1. Ryan and Deirdre met with Cheryl and have contacted Mark Thomas for additional information about how the RUSA organization works.

#### Pins

1. Karen Smith to request submissions the design of the Rambling Randonneur pin.

#### Fleche (May 4 – 6)

- 1. Fleche was very successful as usual. Many thanks to Patrick Wright and Roger Holt for organizing and checking routes.
- Next year entry fees (ride and brunch) and brunch costs (for non-riders) must be paid when the team enters. It
  must be made clear that there are no refunds but substitutions are allowed. For late additions, contact the
  organizer.
- 3. There was discussion on whether or not the control card could be simplified. This may be difficult considering the nature of the event but Andy Reimer will talk to Roger Holt. Roger has the template for the Fleche control cards.

#### Start Times

- 1. As stated in the minutes of April 10, any late starters get the same start time as the main group and late starters must still make the control times. Even if the group starts 10 minutes late, everyone must still check-in at the controls as stated on the control card. There is no 10 minute grace period.
- 2. Keith Nichol will update the ride organizer's checklist.

Regional Route Coordinator's Report – Lower Mainland - Reported by Gary Baker and Keith Nichol

- 1. Rides are going well and riders are enjoying new routes.
- 2. Planning for the 600 is underway. It will start in Abbotsford and go over Manning Park.
- 3. Canada Day ride. Ali and Roger are having trouble securing a start location with enough parking. They are investigating the parking lot at the old ferry slip. Andy Reimer will contact Trinity Western University to see if it is possible to start there and will coordinate with Roger and Ali.

Regional Route Coordinator's Report – Vancouver Island – Reported by Lee Ringham

- 1. Rides are going well and still attracting riders from the lower mainland.
- 2. The VI 400 is up next with the "Highway to Hell" route from Victoria to Union Bay. The 600 will be similar to last

year but the navigation at the will be simplified.

- 3. A women's only Populaire has been suggested. There was plenty of discussion on this topic.
  - The executive felt that skill levels vary regardless of sex and women are not the only slower riders. It was also pointed out that many people will ride a Populaire but aren't interested in longer distances.
  - Susan Allen thought that running an AUDAX style 200 might be more appropriate. For an AUDAX style ride, there could be groups of different speeds and each group would have an experienced randonneur as a leader. With AUDAX style, the group maintains the same average speed.
  - Deirdre objected to excluding people from rides. If there is a women's only ride, is there going to be a men's only ride next?
  - There was a suggestion to hold a free "populaire" style ride evey month. Randon does this. It is free and there is no food, no support, no pins, but there is mentoring. Would a waiver be needed?
- 4. Invitation to attend MEC Bike Festival. Dave MacMurchie received an invitation for the BC Randonneurs to attend the Victoria MEC bike festival. Lee thought that brochures, control cards and pins were some of the items that could be displayed. Lee will ask Dave to go ahead with this. Keith Nichol said that he would investigate the Vancouver MEC Bike Festival.
- 5. Mid Island Velo Association has been promoting summer Populaire and 200.

Regional Route Coordinator's Report – Southern Interior – Reported by Bob Goodison

- 1. The SI200 was enjoyed by 15 riders including five new randonneurs. Four of the five new riders finished the event.
- 2. The 300 is coming up. It will cross into the US at the Night Hawk crossing.
- 3. There is interest in the 400 and 600 and the routes need to be posted.
