12. Post meeting report from Mark Payten re Island rides:

The Comox Valley Crisscross 200 was held for the 2nd time, with 8 riders (1dnf). We also held the Coombs Cumberland 200 in August, 12 riders all finished. Between these 2 rides, we gained 3 new members who joined the rides because they were close to home. Next year we may look at more rides in the mid-Island area.

Of particular note was Erin Biddlecombe. On her first 200 ever, she crashed 15km into the ride, and pancaked her front wheel. Despite valient attempts by other riders (thanks Colin) the wheel was not usable. The organizer drove Erin back to her car, she then went to a bike shop, obtained a new wheel, and drove back to the crash site. Despite losing 2hrs, Erin still finished the ride in 10h35. Erin was impressed with the club, and said "I guess this is what the randonneurs are all about—keep going no matter what."
