Called to Order: The meeting was called to order at 7:05 pm

Approval of Agenda:

Financial Reporting and Membership were added to the prepared agenda.

Approval of Minutes of Previous Meeting:

It was moved, seconded and carried to adopt the minutes of the February 19 meeting as prepared.

Agenda Items:

<u>President's Report</u> – Ryan Golbeck

The social went well and the ride was well attended.

Treasurer's Report - Ross Nichol

The bank account is still healthy but with a lower balance in the operating account after paying for insurance, jerseys, AUDAX fees, and pins. Ross mentioned that the VI1200 would require separate insurance as it is considered to be outside the scope of the normal activities for the club. Insurance for the Rocky Mountain was \$1500.

Social

- The social had a good turnout, 54 people.
- Mike and Brynne Croy were the recipients of the Roger Street award.
- Ken Bonner won the John Hathaway ("Iron Butt") award".
- Ali Holt, Roger Holt and Bob Koen received the 40,000 km award.
- The newly acquired mud flaps sold out.

Fleche - Colin Fingler attended the meeting in order to report on the fleche

- The event takes place on May 3-5. The deadline for submission of teams and routes is April 18
- To advertise the Fleche, Colin will do a write-up to give to the organizers of the spring 200s. He will also put information on both the Forum and the discussion list. He will try to show the list of teams on the web as they sign-up
- Colin has received the pins from Karen
- Colin will chase down the trophies
- Bob March will be the emcee
- Any number of teams will be accepted
- Colin noted that there is an 18% service charge applied to the cost of the brunch
- Colin may post results and routes on the walls in the brunch room
- · Riders will be responsible for getting themselves and their bikes back to Vancouver
- Colin will try to match individual riders up with teams
- Colin confirmed that there are no trophies for the Trace
- Colin will contact Rita Pollock, Dan McGuire and Harold Bridge to see if they will present the trophies.

Club Branding, Clothing, Accessories

The first order of mud flaps have already sold out and another 40 more will be ordered. Lycra jerseys and wool socks will arrive in about 4 weeks.

Constitution and Administrative Roles

This is still under review and there has been no action lately.

Regional Route Coordinator's Report – Lower Mainland - Reported by Keith Nichol

Keith reiterated that routes would not be posted on the web until they have been finalized. A general description of the route will be posted until the final version is available. The Early Bird 200 is ready to go. The spring 200, 300, 400 and 600 are looking good.

Regional Route Coordinator's Report – Southern Interior – Reported by Bob Goodison

Bob reported 6" of new snow in the interior! The spring 300 is ready for the pre-ride. The brochure will be updated when Ryan Kurz returns. The routes for the six-pack (six consecutive 200s in September) are being worked on. One has been pre-ridden.

Regional Route Coordinator's Report – Vancouver Island – Mike Croy

There was a big turnout, 30 people, for the Chili 200. The DNF rate was high but many informed the organizers in advance that they did not intend to finish. Mark Ford has the Victoria Populaire under control. Mike is working on a general promotional poster.

Other business

Inputting results into the database

Ride organizers will be requested to input results in an Excel template and send it to Ryan who will load it into the database. Ryan, Deirdre and others offered to help any organizers having trouble with this. It was noted that the Excel spreadsheet would need to have the rider's ID number and it needs to be correct. In the past Cheryl Lynch has entered the results for all the events. This is a tedious process and she performs many of hours of work with the other tasks as ACP representative.

Route on the website

Deirdre will ask Eric if routes on the website could be posted in both Excel and PDF formats. It's great to have the route archives but it's impossible to cut and paste from the PDF files currently on the site. Deirdre will also ask Tracy to post both formats for the permanents where possible.

Financial Reporting

One member asked for more detailed financial reporting and financial reporting by region. The treasurer is already overburdened but he agreed to try to capture the data in a bit more detail. The member asked for a maximum reserve in the bank. The treasurer mentioned that we have \$28,000 in reserve, and of that, \$5000 is the bequest from John Hathaway which will be used for bicycle advocacy. The treasurer also noted that the club should have at least \$25,000 in reserve as this amount could easily be eaten up by legal fees. The committee agreed.

Items for Discussion by the Committee

It was decided that going forward, any correspondence from members for discussion by the committee would be attached to the minutes. Alternatively, members wanting items to be discussed could attend in person or by WebEx.

New Members and Rules

There was some concern expressed that new riders do not know the rules. Possible remedies were that experienced members can ride with new riders and there could possibly be a link from the Rando Pony to the rules.

Registration cutoff

For some rides, many participants show up too close to the start time and the organizers cannot handle the crush of registrations before the start. In order to handle the start, organizers might need to temporarily cutoff registration 10 or 15 minutes before the start time. The organizers will then have time to give instructions to the riders and start them on time. After that, any other rides can be processed. Eric will be asked to post on the web that the registration will be temporarily

cutoff 10 or 15 minutes before the official start time and then resumed once the processed riders (those arriving on time) have been started.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:34 pm.
