3. Presidents Report: Colin Fingler

- We have 195 current members. We put on 53 events, rode 560 individual brevet rides including 4 Super 600's, rode 85 permanents, earned 41 Super Randonneurs Medals and sent 32 BC riders to PBP in August.
- Keith Fraser wrote a very good article about PBP and it being Deirdre's record 9th consecutive event, which appeared in the Province and The Sun newspapers.
- 1st disbursement from Harold Bridge Memorial fund for PBP first-timer: Jacquetta Bernard was the recipient.
- Regional co-ordinators did a very good job. Routes & ride organizers were identified well in advance. Thank-you to Nigel, Mark P., Bob G. & Wim.
- We now have a Risk Management Committee of Colin, Gary Sparks & Will: reviewed our
 event waiver, signature process, and liability insurance. We have a new 2-sided waiver, and
 in-person signing. Processing at Populaires is a challenge! Gary Sparks did a lot of work on
 drafting the new waiver and upgrading our insurance, giving us better coverage than last
 year.
- Happy to report that we have a successor event to the Rocky Mountain 1200 the Coast Mountain for July of 2020.
- We need to consider the future of large Populaires. There is a demand for them, and they help fund our club, but they are difficult to organize, with potential for volunteer burnout.
- Under Cheryl's lead, we are leveraging our database to support the Randonneurs Canada initiative, encouraged by ACP.
- Etienne did a lot to document the club executive processes. I hope to continue this.
- Peter and Etienne are looking to BCIT to participate in a Student marketing project.
- There was a tragic cycling accident with the loss of Randonneur Michael McIntosh early this year.

4. Treasurers Report: Jacques Bilinski

- There has been a change in provincial legislation, so now the end of the fiscal year must be within 6 months of the AGM, so this year have 2 years of financial statements.
- Therefore, last years AGM costs are included in last years statements, but we can't do that this year. Same for storage locker.
- We are doing well, with no financial problems. Surplus so far is slowly going up. Biggest expenses are pins and insurance. We paid \$2000 for storage but will not need it next year. We also have extra clothing that has not been sold yet. If we didn't have the Populaires, we would have to charge a lot more.

- Vancouver Island: Marc Payten: Had a successful year. Will do another Nov 11 ride. This is the 100th year of signing of treaty of Versailles. Report of rides on island over the season. Ran a small Audax style event in place of the Victoria Populaire. VI volunteers worked well as a group and rides went well. Thanks to Stephen for his lead on our club email group migration from Yahoo to Google Groups.
- Lower Mainland: Will: (Nigel's Report:) 2019: 2 full series, 9 x 200's, 2 x 1000's. Ridership steady. General feedback is routes are good. For next year, calendar is open. But will have a September 1000. Gratitude to volunteers. Ideas for 600 route ideas are welcome.
- South Interior: Jeff: (Bob Goodison's Report): All went well. No road washouts this year. Thanks to Jacquetta for organizing 2 rides. Having discussions about 2020 routes including fall 200 Okanagan Lakes & Trails and a 1000. Any requests?
- Peace: Gary S. (Wim's report): 20th year of organizing Peace brevets. Wim found prep for PBP was a tougher go than usual as other riders went elsewhere and training difficult, so not enough to go to PBP. Looking forward, will organize for next year. All are invited!

10. Active Transportation Strategy Update: Peter Stary

- BC Cycling Coalition is pushing for a transport strategy with the Province. The results are online. There are lots of 'feel good' words, but not many 'action' words. Room to spur action, so those interested should check out the strategy and make your voice heard.
- Discussion about strategy and what it means for us. BC Randonneurs have made written request for the province to consider all roads, including those out of urban areas, with emphasis on shoulder standards.

- Have put forth a document with aims to change the motor vehicle act regarding passing distance. So far the province has resisted in a meaningful way. We need to keep pushing. Will include links with this info, called modernizing the Motor Vehicle Act. It has been difficult to get buy in from some municipalities.

BCIT student teams take on marketing ideas, students do marketing analysis and come up with a plan. We have drawn up a proposal. Not all proposals are taken up, Etienne and Peter involved in the process. There is a \$500 entry fee. Hope it works to bring in more people. Want a younger demographic. Want to be involved? 12. 2020 Coast Mountain 1200: Jeff Mudrakoff, Bob Koen

- Bob Koen is leading an organizing a committee of 7
- Route is Prince George to Prince Rupert return to Smithers.
